



Free Shakespeare in the Park

ACCESS

- Cupertino shows begin at 6pm
- Redwood City shows begin at 6pm
- San Francisco shows begin at 2pm
- Orinda shows begin at 4pm

The show runs approximately 90 minutes and there is no intermission.

Seating is first come, first served. Aisles and walkways will be marked. These spaces must be kept clear at all times.

Lawn chairs are welcome in Cupertino, Redwood City, and San Francisco.

Signage will designate the areas for tall chairs and short chairs.

Bench seating is available in San Francisco and chairs are provided in Orinda - no need to bring your own!

To ensure visibility for all patrons, umbrellas, tents and large shade structures are not allowed. If you arrive late, take care not to |walk in front of the stage. Be prepared to sit where you can find space.

The space is accessible for wheelchair users.

Unattended personal items, including bags, blankets, and ground covers may be removed when the show begins.

WHAT TO BRING

A performance may start out warm and get chilly. We recommend wearing layers! There are only a few areas that may get shade. Use sunscreen and remember to stay hydrated. Please bring your own water. Blankets and ground covers are recommended for Cupertino, Redwood City, and San Francisco.

Blankets may come in handy in Orinda but ground covers are not needed as chairs are provided. Concessions will be available at the Orinda performances. Outside food is welcomed with the purchase of a picnicking fee. Outside alcohol is NOT permitted. The Bruns Memorial Amphitheater grounds and theater is a 'nut-free zone.

Strollers are allowed, provided they are folded down during the performance and not blocking walkways or in the aisles.

- Cupertino: restrooms are located behind the amphitheater.
- Redwood City: restrooms are located behind the playground.
- San Francisco: restrooms are located to the left of the stage.
- Orinda: restrooms are located near the concessions area.

Thank you for joining us for Cymbeline! We appreciate your presence here in the park, in the shared air of this performance setting.

(ymbeline is a late romance, a genre in which Shakespeare combines tropes from his earlier works: you will see elements of comedy, tragedy, and history in this play. You can think of this as

late career impressionism where Shakespeare paints in bold strokes to create a fairy-tale like story.

It is a value of SF Shakes to do our very best to represent the communities in which we perform. In this production we affirm that we stand with our LGBTQ+ community in the Bay Area and beyond, and have reimagined our leading man Posthumus as a trans man on a journey of self discovery and acceptance.

When the Resident Artist company of San Francisco Shakespeare Festival chose Cymbeline, we wanted to invite audiences back to the pleasures of in-person theatre. We understand the unique power of sharing an experience in real time. In this 90 minute fast paced and family friendly production, you will experience music, big performances, sword fights, romance, coming of age, and redemption. We hope that it will spur connection and conversation with your fellow audience members.

SYNOPSIS

In this production, Cymbeline is the king of a fantasy version of ancient Britain, under the rule of the Roman Empire. His daughter, Imogen, is in love with her childhood friend Posthumus, who has recently come out as a trans man. Posthumus and Imogen secretly marry without the permission of King Cymbeline. Imogen's stepmother, the Queen, wanted her to marry Cloten - son of the Queen and Imogen's stepbrother. But when Imogen defies their wishes, Cymbeline has Posthumus banished from the kingdom. Before he leaves, Posthumus and Imogen swear their love for one another and exchange a ring and a bracelet.

Posthumus arrives in Italy, where he meets Philario, Iachimo, and a Frenchman, who brag about how beautiful the women in their countries are. Posthumus lets them know he is married to Imogen, who he considers to be the most beautiful and loyal. Iachimo challenges Posthumus to a bet that he can seduce his wife. Posthumus agrees, wagering the ring that Imogen gave him.

Meanwhile, the evil Queen has arranged for her doctor Cornelius to create a deadly poison for Pisanio, the caretaker of Imogen and Posthumus. Cornelius, the court physician, doesn't trust the Queen and gives her a sleeping potion instead. The Queen gives it to Pisanio, telling her it is a healing potion.

achimo arrives in England to meet and seduce Imogen. When she rejects him, he comes up with a plan to sneak into her room while she is asleep. While in her bedchamber, he steals her bracelet and notices a mole on her breast. Iachimo uses these details to convince Posthumus that he has won the bet, and Posthumus believes him and gives up the ring from Imogen as his prize. Posthumus, furious with Imogen, sends two letters to Britain: one for Imogen asking her to meet him in Wales, and one for Pisanio, telling her to kill Imogen when they get there. Pisanio takes Imogen to Wales and reveals Posthumus's plan to her. However, Pisanio instead helps Imogen disguise herself as a boy so she can meet with Caius Lucius, a Roman general. Pisano also gives the Queen's potion to Imogen, thinking it is a remedy. Back at the palace, King Cymbeline and the Queen refuse to pay their taxes to Rome, so Caius Lucius declares war on Britain.

mogen gets lost in the wilderness of Wales and crosses paths with three rugged Welshmen: Belarius (aka Morgan), a banished noble, and Guiderius and Arviragus (aka Polydor and Cadwal), Cymbeline's two sons that Belarius kidnapped as babies twenty years ago. She does not realize these two boys are her royal brothers. They invite Imogen, who calls herself Fidele, to stay with them in their cave. Imogen is sick from her travel and decides to take the Queen's potion.

loten (son of the Queen) soon also appears in Wales. Disguised in Posthumus's clothes, he is looking for Imogen and Posthumus and has terrible plans for both of them. There he encounters Guiderius, they insult one another and fight. Guiderius then cuts off Cloten's head and tosses it into the river.

Arviragus discovers Imogen passed out from the medicine and thinks she is dead, and they mourn her and lay her beside Cloten's dead and headless body. When Imogen awakes, she mistakes the body for Posthumus since he is wearing Posthumus' clothes. She is discovered with the dead body by Caius Lucius, who offers her a position as assistant, which Imogen accepts.

At the court of Cymbeline, the Queen has begun to go mad because Cloten is missing. Posthumus has returned to Britain with the Roman armies but disguises himself as a Briton with the hope of dying in battle against the invaders. However, with the help of Posthumus, Belarius, and the two brothers, the Britons are glorious in battle. Posthumus removes his disguise and surrenders himself to the Britons as a Roman. He is put into prison where he is visited by his parent's ghosts and the god Jupiter, who gives him a message about the future. Iachimo, Lucius, and Imogen are captured and brought to Cymbeline. The Queen, who is about to die, confesses her evil doings to Cornelius, who reports this to Cymbeline. More confessions ensue: Iachimo admits to stealing the bracelet and lying, Posthumus reveals who he is, Pisanio says that she helped Imogen escape, Belarius admits to kidnapping the two Princes, and Posthumus and Imogen are reunited. Cymbeline accepts Posthumus as a son in law. Finally, Cymbeline frees his prisoners and makes peace with Rome.

The son of a tenant farmer, John Shakespeare was nothing if not upwardly mobile. He arrived in Stratford-upon-Avon in 1551 and began dabbling in various trades, selling leather goods, wool, malt and corn. In 1556 he was appointed the borough's official "ale taster," meaning he was responsible for inspecting bread and malt liquors.


